Course Format

This is an in-person course that will utilize many different introductory exercises and activities in Speech and Debate. A typical class period will feature roughly1 hour of Speech to every 2 hours of debate. Students will engage in hands-on activities, exercises, and workshop time to develop relevant skills in public speaking and argumentation. Worksheets and supplementary materials will be accessible through google drive (and hard copies will be provided to students during the camp).

Course Description

This is a 3 one-week speech and debate camp formulated for middle-school level speech and debate. Each week will build upon skills developed within the previous weeks. Students will spend the speech portion of class time, first, learning about effective public speaking skills, (such as voice, diction, nonverbals, volume, confidence etc), second, giving impromptu speeches and learning speech format, and finally, developing and performing a complete informative or persuasive speech by the end of the third week. Students will spend the debate portion of the class learning about basic argumentation skills, (4-step refutation, how to take notes during a debate round, etc), learning Parliamentary Debate format, and participating in value and policy debate rounds in teams of two.

Learning Outcomes

- 1. Students will become familiar with Speech and Parliamentary Debate formats
- 2. Students will begin to develop effective public speaking skills and become more comfortable speaking in front of their peers
- 3. Students will engage in extemporaneous argumentation by learning how to take notes during debate rounds and coming up with arguments on the fly
- 4. Students will write and perform speeches on topics of their choosing
- 5. Students will think critically about their beliefs and learn to deliver speeches based on their own ideas
- 6. Students will learn to give and receive feedback
